

Peanut Butter Brownie Mix

Ideal to take along in the camper for quick home-made brownies.

Ingredients:

1 cup packed brown sugar
1/2 cup sugar
1/3 cup baking cocoa
1 cup peanut butter chips
1 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 tsp baking powder
1/4 tsp salt
1/2 cup semisweet chocolate chips
1/2 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Additional Ingredients:

2 eggs

1/2 cup butter, melted

1 tsp pure vanilla extract

Directions:

- In a 1-qt glass jar, layer the first nine ingredients in order listed, packing well between each layer. Cover tightly. Store in a cool dry place for up to 6 months.
- To prepare brownies: In a bowl, combine the eggs, butter, vanilla and the dry brownie mix. Spread into a greased 8-in square baking dish. Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes or until set (do not overbake).
- Cool. Cut into squares. Yield: 16 brownies.
